1.1 ORGANIZATIONAL BACKGROUND

SBS Foundation - Towards Total Community Development is a registered Non- Governmental Organisation established in 2004 with an objective to improve socio- economic status of the underprivileged and disadvantaged community women, older person, children and youth. Over the time the work of organization has grown to include a focus on excess to health, education basic rights, environment and community sanitation.

We comprises of a multi- disciplinary team of social science experts, psychologist, environmentalist, legal's, health personals and dedicated team of community level workers and peer educator, who are the integral part of our community based intervention, created both at urban and rural areas.

1.4 PAST EXPERIENCES

1.4.1 Running Project

1. Implementing a project named “Smile Twin e-learning Program” Vocational Skill Training Program for young girls and boys with Smile Foundation since August, 2017. Training sessions are going on for English Speaking, Computer, Retail Management, Personality Development and Career Counseling with 41 youth are enrolled for new batch at Behrampur, Near Vijay Nagar,Rahul Vihar, Ghaziabad U.P..
2. Running a project with Future Sharp Solutions ltd. Under CSR of ITC Group of Companies which includes Vocational Skill Training Program for young boys in order to train them in Field Salesman jobs for FMCG Companies consisting classroom sessions and OJT(On Job Training). A total of 48 Students were trained out of which 31 students were placed with Distributors of ITC Group.
3. Running a Drug de-addiction & rehabilitation Centre for Drug addicts and Alcoholic at Sunlight Colony, Hari Nagar Ashram, New Delhi namely “Navjeevan Nashamukti Kendra” since May, 2016. 52 patients were admitted for drug de-addiction & rehabilitation programme. Alcoholism and drug addiction is a disease and for that abstinence is the best way to manage the condition. Our

approach is holistic, working with mind, body and spirit targeting a complete turned around in behaviors and attitudes of our patients putting them on the path of a healthy and worthwhile life.

4. Implementing a project named "Smile Twin e-learning Program" Vocational Skill Training Program for young girls and boys with Smile Foundation since June, 2016. Training sessions are going on for English Speaking, Computer, Retail Management, Personality Development and Career Counseling with 120 youths are trained in which 76 are placed in various companies from June, 2016 to June, 2017. 41 youth are enrolled for new batch at Mandawali Fazalpur, East Delhi.
5. Implementing a project on TEACH INDIA Programme a **Spoken English Programme for Employability of youth** with the Times of India Group since 2013. 400 learners have completed the course and 60 Percent of the total students got placed in Corporates and Multi-National Companies.
6. Implementing a project on **Domestic Violence against women by forming Mahila Panchayats** (Local legal courts) supported by the **Delhi Commission for Women, Delhi Govt** since 2013. 96 cases of Domestic Violence and Harassment have been covered. Weekly Awareness meetings, Mohalla meeting and Stakeholders meetings are the major components projects.
7. Implementing **Vocational Skill Training Project** at Haliapur Village, Baldirai Block in Sultapur District, Uttar Pradesh since 2014-15. Training has been given on Food Processing (since 2014) and Mobile Repairing (since 2015) in which 130 and 50 beneficiaries have been covered in both trades. Most of passed out learners have formed Self Help Group and engaged in pickle making. After completion of mobile repairing, some of the learners have opened their own shop of Mobile Repair and some of them have placed in company's mobile repair shop.
8. Presently working on Solid Waste Management which involves door to door collection, segregation and composting of Solid Waste under Pratibha-FEMC Ltd under DMRC 2 sites of 3rd phase of Metro line Construction sites since 2008.
9. Providing non-formal education to Street Children/ Rag Pickers at Geeta Colony, Delhi since 2014. 70 children were given non formal education and are mainstreamed in government school in nearby area.

1. **Awareness Programmes** on Legal, Domestic Violence, Street Plays with National Commission for Women at Vasalya Mela, Dilli haat, Noida, Gaziabad and West Delhi in year 2012-13. Expert team has been formed by the organization for performing street play. Team has given name as '**Mehak**'.
2. Seminar on NRI Marriages supported by NCW at Srinivas puri, South Delhi in year 2010-11. Local Stakeholders, NGOs, Advocates, RWA members and local leaders have participated in the event.
3. Research Study on Kishori Shakti Yojna in Ghaziabad district, U.P. supported by NCW year 2012. Analysis has been done on performance of KSY via one to one household survey.
4. Adolescent Health Education programme in 20 schools of East Delhi supported by Directorate of Health Services, NCT of Delhi in year 2013-14.
5. A Temporary Night Shelter at Kishan Kunj, DC Office Geeta Colony for Homeless supported by Delhi Urban Shelter Improvement Board, NCT of Delhi in year 2011-12.
6. Awareness campaigns and sessions on Major Issues like Health, Education, Gender, AIDS, and Environment at Noida and Gaziabad in year 2012.
7. Worked on Solid Waste Management which involves door to door collection, Segregation and Composting of Solid Waste under CEC Soma Ltd under DMRC from 2008 to 2010.
8. Awareness Programs / Workshops with RWA in South City and Central Zone of MCD in collaboration with Delhi Waste Management and MCD from 2009 to 2010.
